Guidance for Creating or Expanding Outdoor Dining

In accordance with the <u>Governor's Executive Order 61</u> the Town of Blacksburg is allowing restaurants to expand outdoor dining during the pandemic. Zoning enforcement of these areas is temporally suspended however every restaurant must get approval from the town to create or expand dining areas. Restaurants must also follow all Virginia ABC and Department of Health guidelines.

The town is amenable to restaurants using space that is owned by the town (i.e. sidewalks and parking spaces) that are adjacent or within close proximity to the restaurant. All that is required in the submission of a diagram of the proposed space demonstrating compliance with VA ABC and Department of Health guidelines (see below).

VA ABC requirements are as follows and can be found in more detail in the attached document:

- The restaurant must have written approval from the Town of Blacksburg for the temporary use of space.
- The restaurant must have written permission from their landlord if they do not currently have control over the proposed space to allow the Virg inia Department of Health or any other regulatory agency access to the area for inspections.
- The outdoor dining area must either be contiguous to the restaurants licensed premises or within 100 feet of the licensed premises.
- A diagram of the proposed space.

All restaurants should refer to the <u>Safer at Home: Phase One guidelines</u> and <u>Executive Order 61</u> for guidance. In addition to these documents the Virginia Department of Health recommends the following for restaurants creating or expanding outdoor dining:

- No need for a health permit, only written permission to use the space and for the department of health to have access (see Virginia ABC's guidelines above).
- No condiments on the tables, single use only.
- Tables and chairs need to be cleaned after each use.
- Bathrooms cleaned at least every hour.
- No more than 10 customers in the restaurant which includes using the restroom, pickup, going from indoor to outdoor areas, etc.
- No bar seating.
- No space limits on any new outdoor seating but:
 - o Tables must provide 6 feet of separation between seated parties.
 - Seating must also provide 6 feet of separation from pedestrian / sidewalk traffic.
 - o Parties/groups can have no more than 10 people.

- You cannot put people together at a table that didn't intend to eat together.
 - I.e. not putting two random groups of four at a 10 top.
- Occupancy many not exceed 50% of the lowest occupancy load on the certificate of occupancy.
- Outdoor space cannot be more than 100 feet from restaurant
- Sanitizer or a way to wash hands for customers.
