Dear Blacksburg Residents,

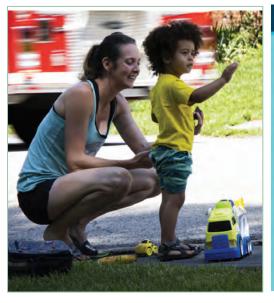

# **BUDGET OVERVIEW**

The purpose of the budget is to plan necessary operating and capital expenditures for the next fiscal year (FY), July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

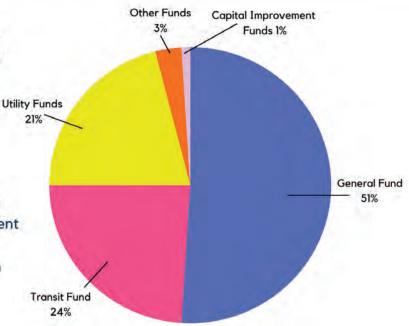
The budget is guided by:

- · Town Council's Vision, Strategic Goals, and Community Values
- The Town's Principles of Sound Financial Management
- · Town Budget Policies

The FY 2025 Budget supports hundreds of services that are delivered by ten operating departments. The total expenditure amount to provide these services is \$105.3 million.

## **GENERAL FUND REVENUES**

The Town's General Fund revenue comes from a variety of sources. Approximately 23.8% of all annual General Fund revenue is from Real Estate Taxes. The remaining revenue sources include meals and lodging taxes, other local taxes, licenses and permits, charges for services, and intergovernmental revenues.

#### **MEALS TAX**

For every \$10 of prepared food purchased, consumers pay \$0.60 in meals tax.



#### **SALES TAX**

For every \$10 of purchases, residents, businesses, and visitors pay \$0.53 in sales tax. Of this amount, the town receives \$0.01.

### **REAL ESTATE TAXES**

For every \$100 of assessed property value, owners pay \$0.26 in Real Estate

For every \$100 spent on lodging, visitors pay \$7 in lodging tax.

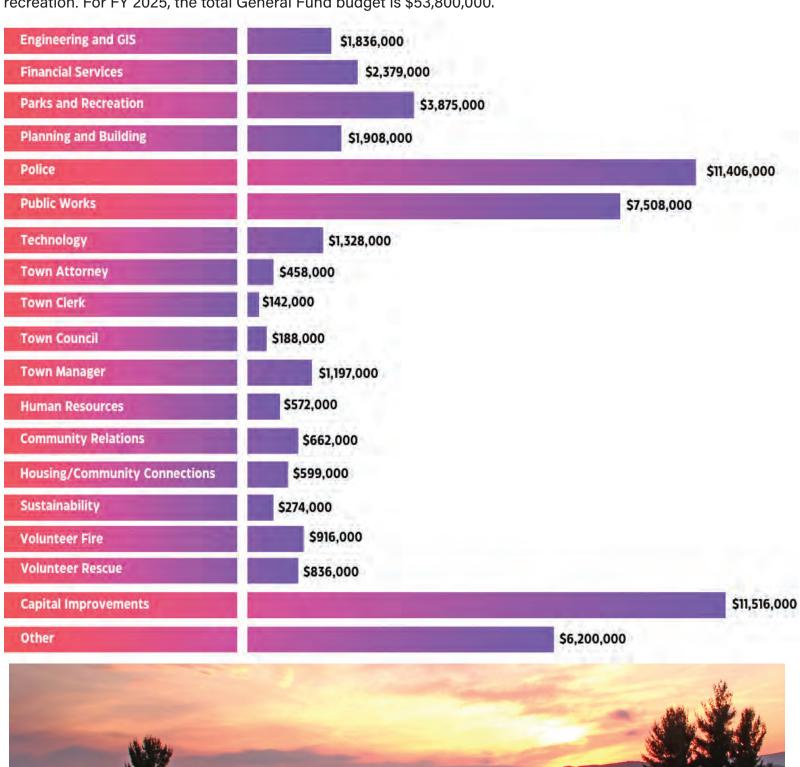
MISCELLANEOUS REVENUES

## **GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES**

The General Fund pays for various public services, such as police, fire and rescue, public works, and parks and recreation. For FY 2025, the total General Fund budget is \$53,800,000.





## **UTILITY FUNDS**

The Town of Blacksburg provides public water, operates the sewer and stormwater systems, and manages the collection of brush, trash and recyclable materials. Fees collected each month from customers pay for the services; no taxes are used. Due to significant infrastructure improvements to the sewer system and rate increases from both water and sewer authorities, combined water and sewer rates are increasing \$0.45 per thousand gallons. There are no changes proposed to the current rates for solid waste and stormwater fees.

## TRANSIT FUND



Blacksburg Transit, operated by the Town, serves Blacksburg, Virginia Tech, and Christiansburg. Funding comes from Federal and State grants in addition to local funds received from Virginia Tech and Christiansburg. The FY 2025 Transit budget is \$25.2 million.

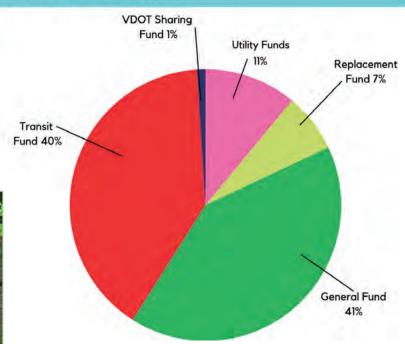
## FY 2025 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The Town prepares a Five-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) each year to plan funding for significant capital projects, such as major infrastructure improvements, construction of public facilities, recreation projects, equipment replacement, and utility system upgrades. The CIP is a comprehensive financial plan that takes into consideration community priorities, projected growth, operational needs, and available funding. The FY 2025 CIP includes \$27.5 million in projects.
